If you are required to file an annual Financial Disclosure Statement, you must also report all travel expenses totaling more than \$375 from a single source on the "Travel" schedule of your annual Financial Disclosure Statement covering this calendar year. Finally, Travel Regulation § 404(d) also requires you to keep a copy of all request forms and supporting information provided to the Committee for three subsequent Congresses from the date of travel.



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The American Exploration & Production Council (AXPC) is a national trade organization representing 31 of the largest independent natural gas and oil exploration and production companies. For more than 15 years, AXPC has hosted an annual Policymaker Field Trip of exploration and production operations in various basins across the U.S. This year, we will be touring operations in the Eagle Ford Shale in South Texas. The field trip continues to be one of the finest ways for energy policy professionals to learn more about natural gas and oil development, and about how today's industry addresses economic and environmental challenges.

What about expenses?

AXPC will cover all travel and meal expenses directly related to participation in the one day field trip, unless participants or agencies prefer to be billed for those expenses. AXPC will provide cost information necessary to comply with any applicable reporting requirements.

Vhat will see

The trip will consist of a review of exploration and production activities in Pioneer's Eagle Ford Shale asset. The tour will include visits to a well pad, a tank battery that stores produced water, a Central Gathering Point (i.e. where raw natural gas is treated for further processing and sales, and condensate is stabilized/distilled for transportation and sales), an active drilling rig, and an active hydraulic fracturing completion operation. The tour will help attendees gain first-hand knowledge of the technologically advanced and complex process of extracting and producing oil and natural gas. Pioneer and industry representatives will be available to provide expert insight and answer questions.
