Suspicious Activity Reporting

SARs focus on observed behaviors and incidents reasonably indicative of preoperational planning related to terrorism or other criminal activity



Suspicious Activity Reporting

- Photography, observation, or surveillance of facilities, buildings, or critical infrastructure and key resources.



Suspicious Activity Reporting

BOMB

HIJACK

- Expressed or implied threat to damage or compromise a facility or structure.

TERROR



Suspicious Activity Reporting

- Eliciting information beyond curiosity about a facility's or building's purpose, operations, or security.



Suspicious Activity Reporting

- Testing or probing of security to reveal physical, personnel, or cyber security capabilities.





Suspicious Activity Reporting

- Material acquisition or storage of unusual quantities of materials.





Suspicious Activity Reporting

- Theft, loss, or diversion of materials associated with a facility or structure.

The Eight Signs of Terrorism

1. Surveillance
2. Elicitation
3. Testing of Security
4. Acquiring Supplies
5. Suspicious Persons
6. Dry Runs
7. Deploying Assets
8. Terrorism Funding

NIAC Intelligence Product

- Will provide an overview of possible unlawful tactics and techniques which law enforcement could encounter by individuals/groups opposed to the Keystone Pipeline
 - Such as during the construction phase

Unlawful Activity in Texas

- From early March 2012 to late February 2013 there have been multiple arrests, these areas include Franklin County, Polk County, Cherokee County, and Harris County.
- On 7 October 2012 in Franklin County, a Texas woman was arrested for trespassing after she stood in the path of bulldozers and machinery.
- On 19 November 2012 four individuals locked themselves to heavy machinery that was being used at Cherokee County construction site. All four were arrested.

Unlawful Activity in Oklahoma

- In February 2013 in Oklahoma City, and Norman there have been multiple arrests on construction sites. The criminal activity has been resisting arrest and trespassing
- In Oklahoma City on 12 February 2013 individuals locked themselves to machinery using chains.
- In Oklahoma City eight people were arrested, two women and six men. There were arrested for trespassing.

Keystone XL Pledge of Resistance

- Released in March 2013, several groups launched the Keystone XL Pledge of Resistance. The groups are asking individuals to sign a pledge to help prevent the Keystone XL Pipeline with actions, including civil disobedience
- As of 24 APR 2013, 59,520 individuals have signed the pledge on the Internet.
